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

# Dr. William K. Dunham Honored at Volunteer Banquet

Dr. William K. Dunham aka Dr. Bill aka Doc, has been honored by the Community of Hope Health Clinic for his service to the clinic for nearly 10 years. During that time, Dr. Dunham has served during the evening clinic, both Monday and Tuesday mornings, and also as the Medical Director on the Board of Directors.

To honor him, The Board of Directors and Executive Director, Justin R. Johnston planned to give him three different honors.

"A few years ago, when Howard Mullis retired, we gave him a service award for all that he had done for the clinic," Johnston said. "We only felt it fitting to give one to Dr. Dunham because he was there from the start as well."

In addition to this award and mimicking what had been done upon Mullis' retirement, the Medical Volunteer of the Year award was renamed as the "William K. Dunham Medical Volunteer of the Year Award." This year's recipient is also a member of the same church as Dr. Dunham in Dr. Jose "Jody" Ortega.

"We also wanted to leave another legacy for the clinic, which Dr. Dunham has given countless hours volunteering to," Johnston said. "So, the Board of Directors at CHHC and myself figured out a way that he will continue to live on with the clinic and the Board by naming him Medical Director, Emeritus."
