"We tried a new format this year and expanded the time," Johnston said. "And I believe it streamlined everything. People were willing to give and give they did."

The goal for the 2019 campaign was \$25,000.

More than \$530,000 was raised between all of the charities which participated, with CHHC getting matching funds of about 7.5%.

CHHC Welcomes a New Volunteer Coordinator

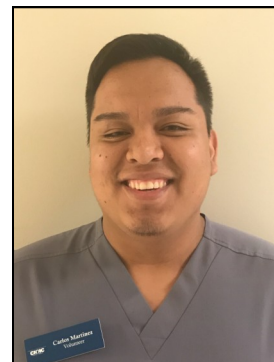
