All three seem to be thriving and we expect to expand more in 2023. Within the next few weeks, CHHC plans to open an on-site dispensary for clinic patients only. Some of the more routine medications will be available during patient visits. This in turn will keep many patients from figuring out how to get to the pharmacy or afford the prescriptions written for them. It makes CHHC more of a "One-Stop Shop."
