Volunteers in Medicine

The Community of Hope Health Clinic is a medical mission in Shelby County that provides non-emergent care to county residents who have no insurance and whose household income is at or below 200% of the poverty level. We are located in the Department of Health building in Pelham. Clinics are held on Monday and Tuesday mornings and Thursday evenings. Other than four paid employees the clinic is run completely by volunteers. If you are interested in volunteering, the following opportunities are available:

Physicians: One of our biggest needs is for volunteer physicians. You may choose to come in the morning or evening, 1-2 days a month or every week. Nurse practitioners and Physician Assistants also are needed

Nurses: volunteer nurses do basic triage, check blood sugars and occasionally prepare injections. This could also be medical assistants, ER tech, or EMT.

Interpreters: We always need people who are fluent in Spanish to do medical interpreting.

Receptionists: Checking patients in and out, preparing charts, filing, and signing up new patients.

Chaplains: Chaplains or lay persons who are interested in talking with patients while they are waiting to see the doctor on Thursday evenings.

Hospitality: Providing a meal to volunteers on Thursday evening is a wonderful way to contribute. Many people come here directly from their day jobs and do not have time to eat before. We like to provide them with dinner.

Donations: Donations can be made for us to buy meals if you are not able to prepare one. Donations for other purposes such as office or medical supplies are always needed and very much appreciated.
