Currently CHHC has approximately 700 patients and more than 2200 patient encounters occur each year.



Services Provided at CHHC include: Primary Care, Physical Therapy, Mental Health/Counseling, Dermatology, and prenatal.



CHHC established an on-site medication dispensary in 2023 and during the first five months provided \$35,000 worth of medication for free to patients.



CHHC plans to expand to more services in 2024 including optometry and an on-site laboratory!
